THE UNIVERSITY

"Preparation for Tomorrow"—that might as well be the theme of Arkansas State University, for that's what an educational stint through this nationally respected institution does for its students.

Whether the learning experiences be in the laboratory, in the dormitory, at a social activity or on the athletic floor, ASU graduates are known for their well-roundedness and readiness to assume leadership and development roles in whatever endeavors they choose to follow.

Strategically located in the Mid-South, Arkansas State is now in its seventh decade as the educational center of Eastern Arkansas. Some 7,000-plus students annually work toward one of the 11 undergraduate or seven graduate degrees offered by the University.

Eight colleges, two departments and one institute comprise the academic structure of the University. Additionally, ASU offers preprofessional courses in dentistry, engineering, law, medicine, optometry, pharmacy and veterinary medicine.

Established by the state legislature in 1909, ASU boasts a beautiful 800-acre campus with physical assets of over \$60 million. It is located in Jonesboro, a city of 32,000 situated halfway between the Mississippi River Valley and the folklore-rich Ozark Mountains.

ASU is rich in organizations—academic, religious, social and professional—with well over 100 opportunities for involvement.


Involvement and participation in as many of these activities as is practical for each student is strongly encouraged. These non-classroom happenings are keys to helping in the development of the total individual—character, personality, attitude, etc.

The intramural and recreational program contains competition in almost every activity imaginable. And it's all centered around the University's two-year-old Physical Education Center—a facility second to none.


Intercollegiately, participation opportunities exist in 15 sports—all on the nation's highest level of competition.

The pop concerts (Barry Manilow, John Denver, Bob Hope, Mac Davis, Johnny Cash, Blood Sweat and Tears, Tom T. Hall, etc.) normally draw people from a four-state area.

A New President

If there was ever anyone ideally qualified to be the President of a progressive, diversified institution such as Arkansas State University, it is Carl Whillock.

When he became ASU's sixth President on July 1, he brought with him a broad and varied background in education, government, law and civic affairs.

Whillock, 52, came to ASU from the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville, where he had served since 1975 as vice president for Governmental Relations and Public Affairs. He had been a top administrator at the U of A since 1966, except for a year and a half when he took leave to serve Governor David Pryor as campaign manager and, later, executive secretary.

A native of Scotland in Van Buren County, Whillock was educated in the public schools at Clinton. He attended the University of Central Arkansas and Emory University in Atlanta before earning a degree in social welfare from Arkansas in 1948.

He earned a Master of Arts in history and political science from Arkansas in 1951 and received the Juris Doctor (Law) from George Washington University in 1960.

After his discharge from the U.S. Navy in 1946, Whillock taught high school. He entered private business with his parents in 1949 but left to become executive assistant to Congressman J.W. Trimble, a position he held for eight years.


He served two terms in the Arkansas House of Representatives from 1953 to 1956.


Whillock entered private law practice in 1963 and served as prosecuting attorney for the 14th

Judicial District for almost a year before becoming assistant to the president of the U of A in October of 1966.


He has been active in civic and community affairs through service on numerous boards. He was chairman of the Fayetteville Housing Authority for six years and was second vice-president and board member of the Fayetteville Chamber of Commerce. He has also served on the board of the Van Buren County Hospital and as president of the school board at Clinton.

Whillock is married to the former Margaret Moore Carter, and they have six children. He has four grown children by a previous marriage.



1978 PREVIEW

Bill Davidson must be up to one of his old tricks again. The eighthyear Arkansas State University boss has been promoting his passing game for 1978, and already skeptics are trying to figure out just who he thinks he's kidding.

"We discovered a new weapon last year," said Davidson, who has 17 returning starters from a surprising 7-4 season. "We have the best passing combination in ASU history, so we'd be stupid not to use it."

Davidson, normally not a proponent of the forward pass, enjoyed the results from it last year (20 of the Indians' 31 scores can be directly attributed to the pass) enough that he dedicated the majority of spring work to it.

Split end Dikki Dyson and quarterback Kennon Taylor comprise that passing combo which should again be one of the best in the South this year.

Dyson, who drew stout reviews from the pro scouts, landed 40 Taylor passes for 710 yards, etching himself into ASU's record book and setting himself up as a '78 All-America candidate. He ranked third nationally by averaging 17.8 yards per catch.

Taylor, who like Dyson is a senior, finished up with 1404 passing yards, the second-best throwing year in ASU history. Considered the "purest" passing quarterback in Arkansas State history, the 6-2, 180-pounder has already vaulted into fourth position on ASU's all-time passing list in only one season as an Indian. Less than 500 yards from being number two, Taylor should reach that plateau in '78.

Although a host of "quality" ball-carriers attracted Davidson's eye during the spring, he still calls the running back situation "a big question mark." Returnees Joe Griffin and Larry Lawrence should have the edge. Those two ended up as last season's top two yardage-collectors (with over 1100 yards between them), even though Lawrence missed the last half of the season because of knee surgery and practiced only the final two weeks during the spring.

Other returning offensive headliners include third-year tight-end starter Danny Garrison, center Bobby Earwood, tackle Jerry Castor and guard Danny Cook.

Earwood, who has been all over the line in one capacity or another since his freshman year, is spending his final season anchoring the spot vacated by four-year starter and all-leaguer Hugh Crisp.

One thing that Davidson and his staff are hoping to rest easy about is a much improved defense. Labeled throughout 1977 as young, green and inexperienced, Davidson now declares that this unit has more depth than any ASU defense of the last decade. Nine regulars are back.

The secondary of Jerry McKenna (he led the '77 Tribe with five interceptions), Greg Lawrence and Enoch Tims should be a deterrent to opposing passers.

Tackles Freddie Lisko and Gene Spears, as well as alternating noseguards Keith Cox and Chet Day and ends Ray Culpepper and Keith Wineland (transplanted from the secondary), offer a solid nucleus for what should be one of the more stubborn fronts among Southland Conference clubs.

Last year's top tackler—linebacker Ralph Kelly—is gone, and twoyear letterman junior Ron Smith is breaking in a new sidekick.

"We are coming off one of our best springs ever," said Davidson. "We had more hitting and there were days I just shuddered. With all that hitting, I don't see how the players managed to stay together. But they did and that's encouraging."

#5—Dikki Dyson Split End, Sr, 6-2, 195, 1L Meridian, Miss.

Keep an eye on . . .


DIKKI DYSON: All-American candidate...one of the nation's top receivers...sure-bet highround draft choice next spring (at least two NFL scouts last season said he would go in top two rounds)...already considered the top receiver in Arkansas State history...quoting ASU Head Coach Bill Davidson: "ASU has never had a receiver as talented as Dyson. On a one-toten scale, he would rate ten."...on a "non-passing" team last year, he caught 40 passes for

710 yards, averaging 17.8 per catch (ranking third nationally in that department)...also had 4 kickoff returns for 48 yards...owns consistent 4.6 speed (has run 4.5)...was second-team All-Southland Conference (only because there was only one receiver spot on that squad—it went to nation's top receiver, from Louisiana Tech)...scouts say his cutting ability, "receiver's hands" and pattern-running make him dangerous...during latter part of '77 season drew double and sometimes triple coverage, leaving other ASU receivers open...extremely self-confident in ability to catch ball and then work on defender...claims his experience as defensive back gives him edge over defender...set ASU record last year with 196 receiving yards against Louisiana Tech...transferred to ASU last year from East Mississippi JC where he was Honorable Mention All-America in both '75 and '76...had 55 catches for 947



yards and 7 TDs in 1976 and 13 catches (in three games) for 403 yards in 1975...started '75 as cornerback with 7 interceptions and moved to wide receiver late in season after starter there was injured...also snagged three interceptions as cornerback during '76...was Mississippi JC All-State both offensively and defensively...captained team in '76...played in state All-Star game...all-conference defensive back at Meridian High in 1974...had four interceptions for state's No. 3-ranked team...had ten interceptions as junior...also lettered in basketball (three years in high school and one year in junior college)...graduated from JC with "B" average ... Dikki is self-chosen nickname (Carter James is given name) ... teammates call him "Silk"... also received scholarship offers out of JC from Duke, Oklahoma State, Kansas State and Grambling, but said he chose ASU because it had just signed a passing quarterback (Kennon Taylor) who was a JC All-American...majoring in soc iology...enjoys reading and music...born 8-18-56...son of Mrs. Ethel Scott.

#7—Kennon Taylor Quarterback, Sr, 6-2, 180, 1L Waycross, Ga.




KENNON TAYLOR: Probably the "purest" passing quarterback in Arkansas State history...a definite honors candidate in 1978...enjoyed the second-best passing season in ASU annals last year...completed 92 of 190 passes for 1404 yards and five touchdowns...those totals moved him into fourth on ASU's all-time passing list (is 475 yards from No. 3 and 489 yards from No. 2)...his 1689 total offense yards (he collected 285 rushing) represents the secondbest season ever at ASU...he enters 1978 tenth on ASU's all-time total offense list...with similar stats this year, he could finish No. 3 all-time behind two four-year starters...set school records last year for most plays in a season (320) and best completion percentage in a game (.643)...led Indians in scoring with 42 points...missed '78 spring game because of rib injury...came to ASU as two-year transfer from Marion (Ala.) Institute where he set six school passing records...was honorable mention All-America as a soph on both JC teams (NJCAA and Gridwire)...Marion (8-2) was ninth-ranked JC team in U.S. in '76 and Taylor was ranked second nationally in total offense and third in passing...Marion stats: as a soph completed 102 of 208 passes for 1597 yards and 18 TDs; as a freshman hit on 95 of 201 for 1059 yards and nine TDs...suffered only six interceptions during JC career...best game in JC was 351 yards and four TDs passing in victory over Florida State junior varsity...also rallied Marion to 23-20 comeback win over Alabama jayvee team...prepped three years at


Waycross High and was three-year QB starter... passed for 1,097 yards and 19 TDs as a senior...played three years of baseball at Waycross and one year at college...4.8 speed...chose ASU over other offers from Clemson, Cincinnati and Louisville...nicknamed "Needles"...married and a father...advanced ROTC student...criminology major...born 11-22-57...son of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Taylor.



Versatile performer who is one of squad's better all-round athletes...has played in 11 games past two seasons and accumulated these stats: 33 carries for 61 rushing yards; nine completions in 26 attempts for 106 yards and one TD with one interception; four catches for 87 yards and a TD...voted Outstanding Offensive Player in '77 Homecoming win over SW Louisiana (passed for one TD and caught game-winner in end zone—both in fourth quarter)...4.8 speed...MVP in '75 high school All-Star game...All-State at Nettleton High in both football and basketball...nicknamed "Cat"...business major...born 11-26-57...son of Mr. and Mrs. Otis Bradley.

HAL BUTLER Center Sophomore 6-3 215 1 L Sikeston, Mo.

JERRY CASTOR Offensive Tackle Junior 6-4 240 2L Douglasville, Ga.



HANK CHANDLER Offensive Tackle Junior 245 2 L East Point, Ga.



CURTIS CLAY Split End Freshman 175 6-0 RS North Little Rock



His actual origin is credited to student Avery Knight, who in 1948 designed a large paper mache head of an Indian to wear on a float during that year's homecoming parade.



Director of Athletics

Dean Pryor is in the middle of his fourth successful year as chief of the ASU athletic program.

His broad and varied athletic background has produced immeasurable returns for the Indians, and he's proven what a difference a little hard work can mean.

Pryor, an all-state footballer and state champion hurdler-long jumper (1949) from Fredonia (Kan.) High School, began his "work means success" philosophy by rejecting several football-only scholarship offers for a joint football-track offer at the University of Arkansas. He started three years in the defensive secondary (two as a teammate of former ASU president Dr. Ross Pritchard) and co-captained the 1952 squad. He also earned three track letters and competed in the '52 Olympic Trials, placing eighth in the

After graduating with honors in 1953, Pryor embarked on a 17-year coaching career with a graduate assistantship in football at the U of A. Coaching duties then followed at Fort Monmouth, N.J. (while in the Army), Lakeland (Fla.) High, Coffeyville (Kan.) Junior College, Wichita State, Hastings (Neb.) College, Kansas State and South Dakota State. His head coaching record for seven years in that capacity at three schools was 35-33-1. He was also head track coach at Coffeyville when that school won the 1960 national JC championship.

Pryor moved into athletic administration in 1973 after a year-and-a-half in a real estate position in Bentonville. He returned to Kansas State as an administrative aide and stayed two years before accepting the ASU post.

Total reorganization of the Indian Club into its present, more practical structure and the establishment of the new and successful "Steer for State" program have been two of his most beneficial ASU projects. He is also a member of the Governor's Council on Physical Fitness in Sports.

Now 47, Pryor is married to the former Betty Castleberry of Newport and they have three daughters and a granddaughter.

Bill Davidson

Head Coach

Winning seasons are nothing new to Bill Davidson. In 21 years of coaching, he has been involved in 17 of them. Eight of those have been championship seasons—a pretty strong success ratio in anyone's book.

Over the past five seasons, Davidson's clubs have posted a 37-16 reading. That's an average of 7.4 victories per season, which ranks the Indians among the Top Twenty major teams in the nation in that department. Davidson also ranks among the Top Twenty major coaches in the nation with his .698 winning percentage over that span.

During his nine-year tenure as ASU's offensive coordinator and line coach (prior to becoming head coach), he was regarded as one of the best in the country. He tutored All-America linemen Dan Summers, Dan Buckley, Bill Phillips and Wayne Dorton and taught another (Jack Smith) who was a second-team All-American. His colleagues say he is an adept teacher with an uncanny ability to inspire his players.

His appointment as head coach in 1971 was a dream come true for Davidson, for it was during his collegiate career at ASU that he decided to become a coach.

Enthusiastic and tough on the field, Davidson is approachable and candid. Fans and reporters find him friendly and easy-going, and he is held in high esteem by other members of the coaching fraternity.

His 11-0-0 Indian club in 1975 has been voted by ASU fans as the "Greatest Team" in the school's history. He was named Southland Conference Coach of the Year in '75 and also received some votes for national Coach of the Year honors.

Davidson is the 20th head coach in ASU's 64-year football history. He is the fifth ASU player to return to his alma mater as head coach.


EDUCATION: Graduated from Manila (Ark.) High School in 1953. Received BSE from Arkansas State in 1957. Earned MSE from ASU in 1963.

COACHING EXPERIENCE: Davidson began coaching at Earle High School in 1957 and wasted no time establishing some respectable credentials. His first team went 9-2. He followed up with 10-2 and 9-3 marks, winning back-to-back district championships at the Class B school. He carried a 28-7 three-year record with him to Jonesboro High (then Class AA) in 1960 and posted a 7-4-1 reading. Consecutive Region 2AA titles followed in 1961 (10-1) and 1962 (11-0), and then Davidson's talents were summoned by ASU. He became offensive coordinator and line coach in 1963, Bennie Ellender's first year as head coach, and held that post until 1971 when he was appointed to fill the vacancy created by Ellender's departure to Tulane University. Davidson's seven-year head coaching record at ASU is 44-28-1 (.610). Nine of those losses have been by three points or less. His overall head-coaching record is 100-40-2 (.704).

PLAYING EXPERIENCE: Bill did not play high school football. He was a standout baseball player and also played basketball at Manila High School. He was introduced to football as a freshman at ASU in 1953 and lettered three years as a center and linebacker. He also played baseball at ASU.







native has a varied athletic background—six years as a sports editor, four years as a sports information director, and four months as an interim athletic director (at ASU).


GINA BOWMAN

Pride & Tradition at ASU

NICKNAME—The nickname "Indians" is taken from the heritage of the state of Arkansas—from the Osage tribe which roamed Northern Arkansas before the settlers arrived. During the 18th Century the Osage were at war with practically all other tribes of the plains and with woodland tribes as well. For that reason, ASUers look with pride to the fighting spirit which dwelled among the Indians of Northern Arkansas. "Indians" officially became the school's athletic nickname in 1931. The first nickname in 1911 was "Aggies", since ASU was the only agricultural school in Eastern Arkansas. The word "Farmers" was also used. In 1925 it was changed to "Gorillas," but that name didn't stick. "Warriors" was adopted in 1930, and it evolved into "Indians" one year later to give the school a strong representation of the heritage of Northern and Eastern Arkansas.

COLORS—The colors Scarlet and Black were selected in 1911, the year of the first football team, by a committee of several students and one faculty member. Their first official use as school colors was on a pennant.


MASCOT—The ASU mascot is actually a trio of Indian-attired students popularly known as The Indian Family. Chief Big Track (named after the legendary chief of the Osage tribe which occupied Eastern Arkansas) is


the head of the Family, which also consists of an unnamed princess and an unnamed brave. The expensive costumes worn by the Indian Family are styled after the fashion of the Arkansas band of the Osage tribe. Chief Big Track's uniform, valued at over \$1,000, consists of 495 parts. It took nine persons working 220 man-hours to assemble it. Over 800 yards of thread was used to sew the eagle feathers to the headdress, and each feather was stitched individually, so that they almost swivel in the wind.

SYMBOL-"Jumpin' Joe" (see page 13).

SONGS—"Hail to ASU", the school's alma mater, was written by Dr. Harold Manor, former head of the University's Fine Arts Department. The arrangement used presently was designed by Harold Worman, a former associate band director. Two other popular "school" songs played at all athletic events are "The ASU Fight Song" by George L. "Pop" Hodge of Marked Tree and "Cherokee" (Indian dance music) by Ray Noble.

VICTORY RIDE—Chief Big Track of the Indian Family celebrates each ASU touchdown by riding horseback across the field or around its fringe. At old Kays Stadium, last used in 1973, he always rode around the track at full gallop, waving to the fans as he passed in front of them.

PARKING: Parking in a special lot on the west side of the stadium (near the Press Box) is available to members of the working media. Special permits are required and may be obtained by contacting the Sports Information Director at least a week in advance of each game. Permits are issued on a single game basis.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: The stadium lighting system has a color temperature of 3400 degrees Kelvin. Excellent results have been obtained with ASA 160 daylight color film (shooting at f-4). Filmers and still photographers may operate from the photo deck (on Press Box's top level) or from the sidelines. A press pass is required in both areas. Request credentials from the Sports Information Director.

RADIO: ASU has two radio booths-one for KASU-FM, the ASU-owned pilot station of the Indian Network, and the other for the official designated outlet of the visiting team. Press passes should be requested through the Sports Information Director. However, requests concerning broadcasting rights should be made to Charles Rasberry, Director of Broadcasting, Arkansas State University, State University, Ark. 72467. Stations desiring to carry broadcasts of Indian games should contact Rasberry at least three days in advance of the desired game.

SCOUTS: Professional scouts may enjoy all the services of the press box for a special \$12 fee. College scouts are permitted in the press box on a space-available basis (only one scout per school). Space for pro scouts will be allocated on a first-come, first-serve basis. We assume no responsibility for scouts who appear at the press box unannounced. Requests for scouting credentials should be made directly to the Sports Information Director.

PRESS BOX SERVICES:

- +A refreshment bar (serving soft drinks and sandwiches) is open before the game and at halftime.
- +Press Packets (containing programs, flip cards, up-todate statistics, etc.) are distributed prior to the game.
 - +Play-by-play is handed out at the end of each quarter.
 - +Abbreviated statistics are available at halftime.
- +Final statistics (team, individual, defensive) and dressing room quotes are issued as soon as possible after each game.
- +Western Union service is not available, but there is ample telephone service in the Press Box. Telephones may be reserved for \$10 per game each.
- +A telecopier is available on a priority basis with a \$5 charge for use of the machine and the sender.
 - +Separate men's and women's restrooms are available.
- +Anyone desiring additional or any special information should make arrangements in advance with the Sports Information Director.
